MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT TIME HERE AGAIN

For those of us already on Medicare, the time to pick next year's Medicare Prescription drug or Medicare Advantage plan begins on October 15 and closes on December 7. As mentioned in this newsletter, Terrie Hilderbrandt from the Lebanon County Area Agency on Aging will be here before the beginning of the October Residents' meeting at 6:30 p.m. on October 9. She

will give a brief talk to try to demystify the intricacies of the Medicare System. In addition, the Agency offers individual appointments to help people with their unique medical insurance needs. For an appointment please call 717-273-9262. Remember, these plans change every year, and sometimes our needs also change. This is why it pays to review your choices every year even if you're happy with what you have. There might be a better choice for you for next year. If you prefer to do it yourself, the plan finder tool on the Medicare.gov website is a great resource for this. Just remember, the volunteers at the Agency and on the Medicare website will give you unbiased information on ALL the plans available, not just on the 2 or 3 offered by any single company.

For those who will soon be going on Medicare, I urge you to make an appointment before you make your choice. The options are confusing, the sales pitches are enticing, and the initial choices can have lifelong impacts. You only get one "INITIAL ENROLLMENT PERIOD" when you cannot be turned down by any plan. Remember, this is just the start of the next phase of your life. You need to plan for the future as well as today. Appointments for people new to Medicare can be made any time of the year in which you become eligible for Medicare. The phone is the same, 717-273-9262.

After receiving many requests from the community, we have been able to reschedule our trip to Wellsboro and the Pennsylvania Grand Canyon. This is promising to be an exceptional day as the weather should be a lot cooler and the fall foliage should be gorgeous.



We will begin our day in Wellsboro with the famous 3-1/2 hour wagon ride down to the falls followed by our return to the starting place of our trip for the "Cowboy Cookout". NOTES FROM MARILYN: (OCTOBER 2023)

- 1. We will be having a vaccine clinic on Wednesday, October 18 from noon to 3:30 p.m. If you have not registered, please contact me to get on the schedule. Walmart is offering the following vaccines: COVID (most recent), Flu (High Dose 65), Pneumonia (updated Prevnar), RSV, Shingles, and Tetanus. Also, let me know if there are any other vaccines you may need that Walmart could provide upon my request.
- 2. I have heard that some people have been receiving other residents' mail in their mailboxes. If this happens, you can:
 a) take the mail to the home of the recipient(s) b) put the mail in the outgoing mailbox with a note stating that it was put in the incorrect mailbox c) put the mail in the outgoing mailbox. [Delivering the mail to the correct person saves delivery time by the postal service plus you get to talk with your neighbor!]
- 3. Sewer clogs are still happening. If a wipe says it is flushable it is not. **Please do not flush wipes.** They are a big problem in our sewer system and at the Sewer Plant.
- 4. Community Center Gym:
 - Please do not take it upon yourself to change the thermostat. If the person who likes it 64 degrees keeps changing it, the air conditioning system will freeze up; and then everyone will be warm. I went into the gym the other morning and heard a weird noise coming from the AC unit. Hopefully I saved it in time from doing any damage.
 - We moved some equipment around in the gym to hopefully accommodate people. We have put a fan in the gym for the people who overheat when exercising on the bikes that we moved. Hopefully we have succeeded, and everyone is comfortable.
- 5. It is that time of year again when we need your assistance with the streetlights. If you notice a streetlight flickering or not working, please let us know so it can be repaired.
- 6. Usually leaf pickup occurs during the first 3 weeks of November; however, we have to see when the leaves will actually begin to fall this year before a schedule is set. I will get that schedule out to you soon. NOTE: LEAF PICKUP WILL BE ON FRIDAYS THIS YEAR.
